THE PROJECT

The I Meditation Artistic Retreat will bring together twenty-five artists from all around the world practicing different artistic disciplines. They will spend two weeks at the Muktawan Sanctuary meditating guided by Thai Teaching Monks and creating artworks forming the "Samadhi - Santi Collection of Contemporary Art". Few days after, the artists will exhibit the Collection in Bangkok and later on in Art Galleries from all around the World, spreading like this a message of peace and tolerance through Contemporary

MEDITATION RETREAT

EXHIBITION IN BANGKOK

Four days after the Artists come back to Bangkok, on Friday January 31st, the Opening Ceremony at the Gallery will inaugurate officially the Exhibition of the Samadhi-Santi Collection of Contemporary Art. A private event that will get together devotees of Contemporary Art having the chance of enjoying first-hand the Collection.

A day after, on Saturday February 1st, the Exhibition will be open for the general audience.

THE ARTISTS

The twenty-five artists participants of the Meditation Artistic Retreat have been carrying out a 42-day Online Meditation and Self-Development Program in order to train their meditation and concentration skills, being able like this to take the best of the Retreat from the very first moment.

The application process opened last August and closed on September 31st having collected **four hundred applications of artists from eighty-two different countries.** Thus, the selective and exhaustive process of shortlisting candidates ensures the exquisite quality and high level of the artists participating in the Project and responsible of the Art Collection development.

THE COLLECTION

Samädhi – Santi Collection of Contemporary Art, where "Samädhi" is the term in Sanskrit to refer "Meditation" and "Santi" means "Peace" in Pali language.

The twenty-five artists from all around the World will work during two weeks at the Meditation Retreat to create artworks following the same theme and mission: Giving shape to the pure feelings and deep emotions that grow inside after finding inner peace through meditation practice.





Luciana Duarte acts in three main fronts: Professor/Researcher of Production Engineering, Designer/Artist and Ethical Fashion Activist in Brazil.


As an artist, she participated in four main exhibitions in Brazil, including the IV Brazilian Biennial of Design.



His interests as an artist have always been deeply linked to the issue of volume and void, as well as on how these elements are set in space. This background led him flip over this deep interest in understanding the various connections which are set between his artwork and the landscape and how the viewer is immersed between this links; on how nature, the artist and the viewer are in a particular time and interact among themselves.

His projects have always started from a very subjective view in terms of his personal experiences and anecdotes and in how they shape his material choices. Each of these materials has a peculiarity in itself that allows him to create a unique and creative language that he intends to get rich constantly. Each material represents and conveys something very special for him; this relationship is deeply tied to the language and the message he wants to express. That is the reason why he simply cannot repeat himself, every piece of art he does teleports him to a unique and unrepeatable moment and it becomes special.

For Rodrigo, each of his art pieces are a search to know himself, to discover him, to bring out his feelings, to connect with his essence and from that moment that he recognizes himself he is able to recognize other people as well. 










She creates unique direct positive photographic images from objects.

Either free floating or preparing glass plates often painting into the subjects before composing them within an enlarger, Joanne exposes them to colour and light and project through a lens whilst recording onto ilfochrome colour photographic paper. This paper is then developed via a chemical process and rinse bath.


It is both the transmitted and the reflected light which passes through and bounce off her subjects that is recorded onto the light sensitive paper.

This combination together with a carefully selected depth of field translates as transcendental beauty.
